Lovely people, hard working and in relation to Crime Prevention, they were doing a good job. **But Hackney Homes, the Local authority and some senior police Officers were not fully aware of what was required of them particularly in relation to Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998..**

Section 17 of the Crime and Disabled Act 1998...

2.

A Statutory Responsibility.

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 requires local authorities to consider crime and disorder reduction in the exercise of all their duties, activities and decision-making. This means that all policies, strategies and service delivery need to consider the likely impact on crime and disorder.

This legal responsibility affects all employees of the Council as well as those agencies that are contracted by, or that legally contract to work in partnership with, the council in the provision of services.

The exact wording of the legislation is:

' Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed upon it, it shall be the duty of each authority to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

The Home Office issued guidance that describes the legal responsibility in plainer language:

' ... a general duty on each local authority to take account of the community safety dimension in all of its work. All policies, strategies, plans and budgets will need to be considered from the standpoint of their potential contribution to the reduction of Crime and Disorder .'



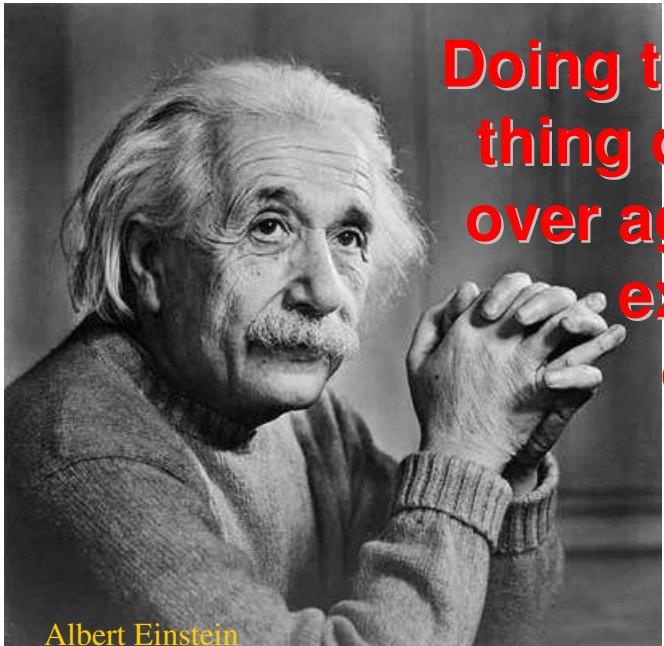
