The event will showcase the talents of various singers, dancers and musicians from a variety of cultural backgrounds and will prove to be a fun evening out for all the family.

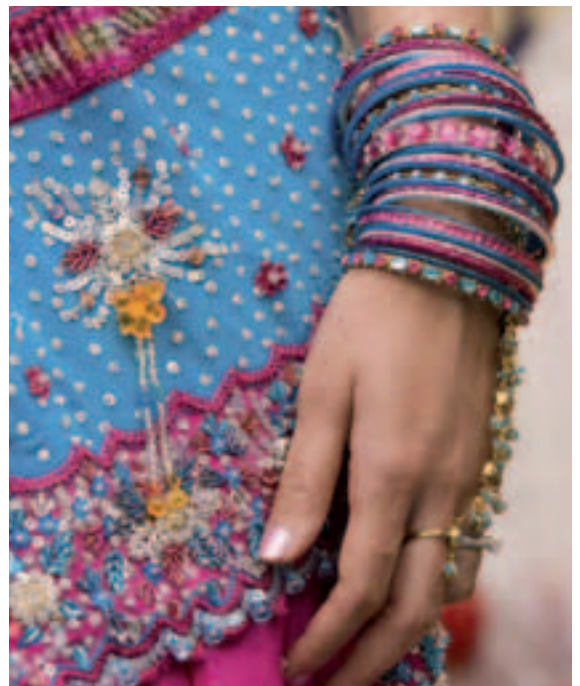

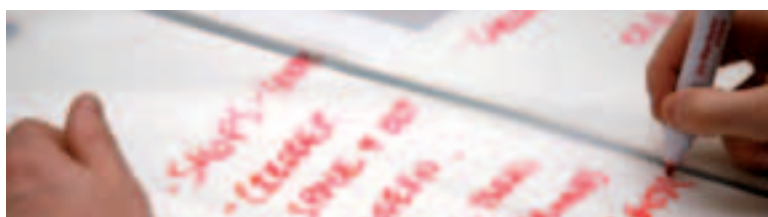
Carol Jokhoo said of her victory last year, **“I was touched by what people said about me. I want others to see their own potential and recognise their own skills.”**

Previous sessions saw the questions ranging from repairs to cleaning on estates and the way we deal with your complaints.

Annual report for Hackney Council tenants now available



From 1 October 2010, all providers of social housing are required to publish an annual report to tenants (and provide this to the Tenant Services Authority).

Hackney Council wants the report to reflect what residents are interested in and that is why we used your feedback from recent surveys to identify the areas that you said were most important to you.

We know that you want:

- to have an improved repairs service;
- us to do more to tackle anti-social behaviour and
- do more to ensure that your estates are clean and well maintained.

The annual report concentrates on these issues and discusses how we are making improvements in these and other areas.

says Hackney Homes

Hackney Homes is on hand seven days a week including bank holidays to deal with anything that poses a risk to residents or the environment.

The team of plumbers, carpenters and heating engineers are called out to thousands of emergencies a year to make them safe.



The team can be contacted on **020 8356 3691**; they will get to you within two hours, make the situation safe and ensure that you are reassured. If it is not an emergency, residents can contact the daytime repairs contact centre to make an appointment.

Some examples of emergency issues include flood, fire or explosion, major plumbing and electrical faults.

Affected by anti social behaviour or want to learn more?

Hackney Homes is holding an Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) Forum: 'Let's tackle ASB together' on Saturday 13 November at 10am.

This interactive event will be at Morley Hall, 125-127 Mare Street, E8 3RH. There will be workshops on noise nuisance to tenant rights, a chance to ask the panel questions and a theatre performance to challenge perceptions about ASB.

2012 Olympic update

2010 is an exciting year for Hackney residents. With less than two years to go until the Olympic and Paralympic Games, everyone is interested in getting involved with the Games.

The 2012 Unit in Hackney Council has been working to make sure that local people benefit. The following are three of the biggest opportunities coming up:

- **BBC Work Experience Scheme**
We are working with the BBC to create a work experience scheme only open to residents of the host boroughs. Given the fierce competition applicants would face on the BBC's main scheme, this is a great chance to work with the BBC.



- **Westfield Stratford City** Due to open next year, some employers like John Lewis and M&S will be hiring later in 2010. We're working with the on-site training provider to ensure that local people can get access to high quality training before the main development opens up.
- **Olympic and Paralympic Games**
We will soon know who the main companies are who will provide catering, cleaning, security and waste management services. Once we know this, we will work with them to find out what their requirements are and ensure that local people get a chance to work in the Olympic Park during the Games.

Scrutiny launches tenant participation review in Hackney



A review has been launched in Hackney to look at how social housing tenants can work more effectively with their landlord.

The Living in Hackney Scrutiny Commission will examine how tenants can improve their living conditions through better engagement with social housing landlords.

Recipe

Tomato and basil pasta



Ingredients:

3-4 tomatoes
Virgin olive oil
Olive oil
1 clove of garlic
1 handful of basil, torn
Pasta
Black pepper
Parmesan cheese

Instructions:

In a serving bowl, cut up the tomatoes, add a good drizzle of virgin olive oil, one crushed garlic clove and a handful of roughly torn basil leaves.

Cook the pasta according to packet instructions, drain and return to the saucepan with the tomatoes.

Season with black pepper and add plenty of grated Parmesan cheese.

You can also add in chopped bacon or mushrooms if you fancy something different.

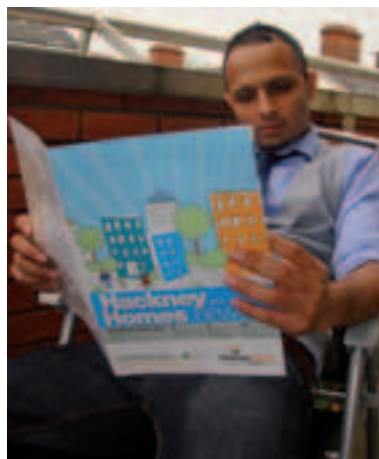

Protect your valuables in the event of vandalism, theft, fire or flooding with home contents insurance from as little as £1.35 per week, or from just 90p a week for tenants aged over 60. Over 2,500 Hackney Homes tenants are already signed up. The benefits include no increase in premiums if you make a claim and a range of payment options to suit your needs.

In addition, an anti social behaviour (ASB) surgery will be held every Friday from 2 to 5pm where residents will be able to speak to specialist ASB officers in confidence about any particular concerns they may have.

Stand up and be counted Register to vote

In August, the Council delivered green electoral registration forms to every household in the borough. A big thank you to everyone who has returned them so far.

Even if you are not going to vote, you must return your form by the end of November. If you don't, you won't be able to vote in any election or referendum held in 2011, it could affect your ability to get credit and you could be fined £1,000.

An expert's guide to... finding a new home

In every issue of Hackney Homes News, we ask one of our experts about a range of issues that affect you in your home. In this issue, we are talking about moving into a new home.

Many tenants move into their home and then years later, when circumstances change, they may want to move somewhere else. There are a number of options if you who are interested in moving into a new home:

- **Register with HomeSwapper:** If you are a council tenant, you can now register on www.homeswapper.co.uk to swap homes with another tenant. This is called a "mutual exchange" and you get to choose the home yourself. Once you have found the property you want you must obtain written permission from your landlord. For more information, contact your neighbourhood housing office.
- **Is your home overcrowded?** The Choose and Move Scheme is aimed at helping over-crowded tenants into the private sector. You must be on the Council's waiting/transfer list, resident in Hackney and assessed as overcrowded. Find out more on **020 8356 5823/2976**.
- **Is your home too big?** The Cash Incentive Scheme offers cash to tenants who transfer to a council or housing association property that has fewer bedrooms. We give grants and help with removal costs if you are re-housed. Find out more on **020 8356 5752/2978**.
- **Are you looking for a home outside London?** The Fresh Start Scheme offers private renting and social housing opportunities out of London. Find out more on **020 8356 5751**.
