She continues to be a driving force in tackling ASB across the whole of Hackney and encourages residents to report ASB and have pride in their neighbourhood. Alice also acts as an advocate for ASB victims and always champions the concerns of residents, including young residents who have traditionally been 'hard to reach.'

Wayne Hylton, Hackney Homes' Estate Safety Manager, was Highly Commended in the Tim Winter Category for exceptional performance by an employee of a SLCNG member organisation in tackling anti-social behaviour and making a real and sustained difference to an individual or a community.
